estimate and it seems that the roofing contractor will complete the repairs at cost, somewhere in the \$12,000 range, saving the WFPA thousands.

Merchandise Sales -We discussed the possibility of needing to increase the budget an additional \$2000 for the year. We do have monies available in other quarters \$850.00 in October and another \$850 in May. If it is needed we can address it at a later meeting and make adjustments.

FF Appreciation Follow Up

We had over 200 attendees. A good time had my all. It seems that the sound system was not working correctly and we ran out of chairs. Both of these will be addressed corrected for the next event. It was determined that the sound systems speakers were not connected correctly. On the issue of chairs we should start replacing some of the old ones and adding some additional inventory for the next large event.
