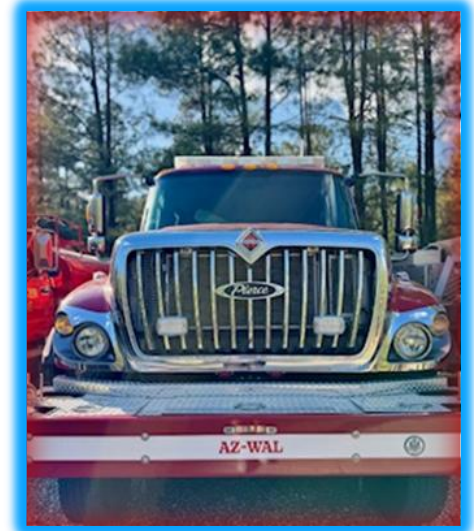

From The Fire Chief:

This past winter was remarkably dry as we all know. There was just one snowstorm of any consequence with a little bit of rain. The lack of precipitation and expectations for the El Niño/La Niña cycle, it looks like we are in for a dry spring and summer. We can of course hope this forecast turns out to be incorrect but as we talk about in these letters every spring, the burden falls to us to educate new neighbors and the many visitors we get to the Walker area about the danger of fire.

Last year we responded to an illegal burn, just a campfire, at house that was practically right next to a fire ban sign. The guests drove by regularly and did not know that it meant no campfires. It would be better to assume that guests are oblivious.

If you rent out your place as a short-term rental, please make it a house rule that there are no fires of any kind allowed.

For those of us who live here, please make good decisions about anything that could cause a fire. Most wildland fires are human caused by human error. Please comply with seasonal fire restrictions when they are imposed which we believe will be earlier than normal.

Our various department improvements are continuing. We are currently working with the County to try to sort out permitting for a new building that will house Engine 83 and Brush 80. Hopefully this will be sorted out soon and we can get started this summer. This will give us much more room in the main station house, we park six vehicles in four garage bays with only an inch or two of space between the stacked vehicles.

Additionally, once the new building is completed, we will be able to upgrade Water Tender 81 to something a little newer and probably a little bigger. We cannot replace Tender 81 until the new building is complete because a newer water tender is unlikely to fit in the building if it has to share a space with another vehicle.

Speaking of Brush 80, the new Brush 80 is in service. We took the tank, pump and the rest of the equipment off of the 2006 Ford chassis and moved it over to a 2026 Dodge Ram chassis. The truck drives fantastically well and the fire suppression equipment is of course very familiar to everyone on the department.

As has been the case for many years, your best source for reliable and current information during a large fire or other incident is the department's Facebook page. We also post information about fires outside our area on that page that might impact us with drift smoke.

From The President:

Dear Walker Residents,

As we head into another year of community activities and preparations at Walker Fire, I wanted to take a moment to share a little more about how the department operates and how the support from our community helps keep it running.

Walker Fire is a 100% volunteer organization, and the department relies heavily on the support of the Walker community. While the Fire Chief and volunteer firefighters are responsible for emergency response, training, and operational readiness, the Walker Fire Protection Association Board of Directors focuses on ensuring the department has the financial and organizational support it needs to operate successfully.

Many people ask how Walker Fire is funded. Unlike large municipal departments or fire districts which receive tax receipts and revenue, Walker Fire relies on a combination of community support and donations, fundraising events, grants, and program revenue to help cover operational needs.

Throughout the year, events such as our Pancake Breakfasts, Fish Fry dinners, and other community gatherings at the fire station help raise funds that go directly toward supporting the department. In addition, the Board actively works to pursue grants and other funding opportunities that help provide equipment and resources that support the firefighters and the community. Walker Fire is also able to raise funds through participation in wildland fire assignments, where trained members of the department assist on incidents when requested. Revenue generated through these deployments is used specifically to help purchase new equipment for the department.

Another important area we will continue working on this year is supporting community wildfire mitigation efforts. Walker Fire will again be partnering with the Walker Community Action Alliance to help organize Chip & Haul events that allow residents to dispose of slash and reduce vegetation that can contribute to wildfire risk in the area.

Walker Fire is truly a community-supported department, and the involvement of residents plays a major role in keeping the organization strong. Whether it's attending events, volunteering your time, or supporting fundraising efforts, every contribution helps ensure that the department can continue serving the Walker community.

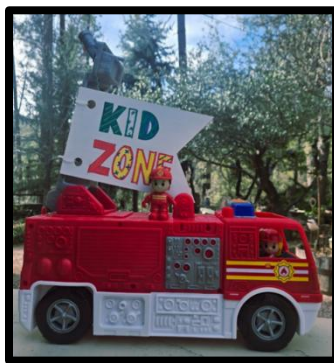

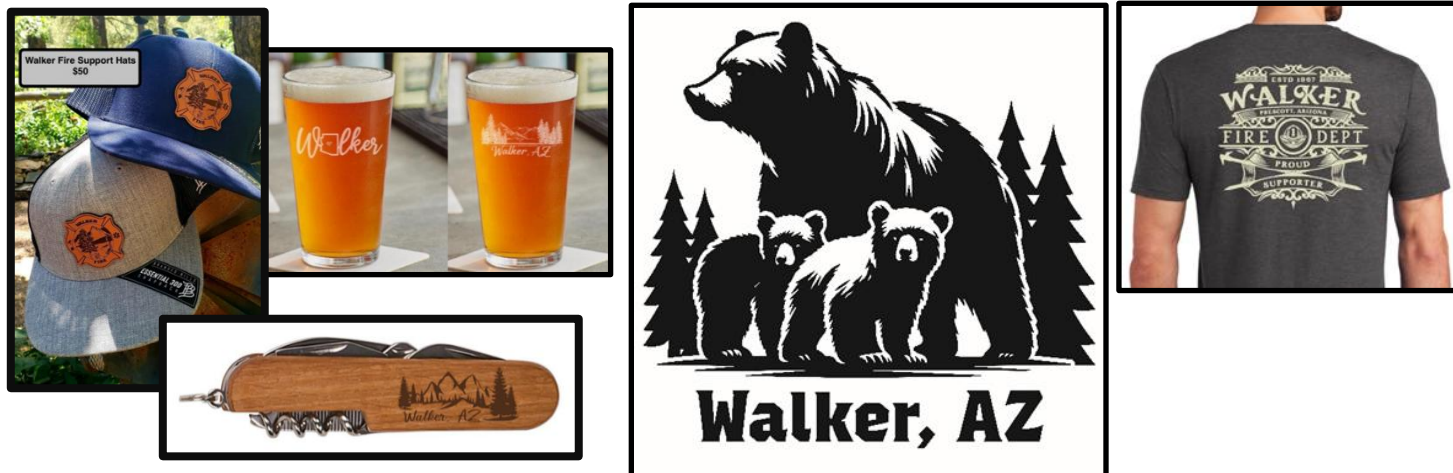


WFPA – Walker Merchandise

WCAA – Walker Firewise Update:

Tribute to Loren Bykerk:

It is with great sadness that we report the recent passing of Loren Bykerk, who was the founding father of the WCAA Walker Firewise Program. He not only established Walker as a USA Firewise Community in 2010, but he also obtained numerous Firewise grants and saw to their successful administration for the past 16 years. He brought in hundreds of thousands of dollars for Firewise mitigation of property throughout Walker/Potato Patch and for annual Chip and Haul events, making our community safer. He will be sorely missed.

Healthy Forest Initiative Grant:

WCAA Walker Firewise is currently administering a \$203,161 for roughly 70 acres reimbursement grant for Walker property owners. As of now, your Firewise team has performed over 20 property mitigations for a total of 41 acres. The grant was just extended 6 months (9/30/26). That means that 29 acres remain to be completed during the extension period. There are currently a few properties in various stages of completion. Walker CHIP & HAUL PROGRAM 2026: June 19th to July 15th, 2026 at the Walker Fire Station

IMPORTANT UPDATE: Due to a significant reduction in grant funding, no funding has currently been secured for 2026. WCAA has applied for a \$3,000 grant; however, it has not yet been awarded.

As a result, **community donations will be more important than ever** to help cover program costs this year. The Chip & Haul program cost \$27,929.94 in 2025, funded through a combination of grants and community donations.

WHY THIS MATTERS:

Chip & Haul reduces wildfire risk. Every load removed helps protect homes, property, and surrounding forest.

DROP-OFF GUIDELINES ACCEPTED -- Natural vegetation (slash) only

DO NOT DROP OFF - Lumber • Root balls • Plastic bags • Metal • Bricks/blocks • Trash/garbage

Loads containing prohibited materials will be rejected.

FIREWISE TRACKING: Pick up a time sheet at the Firewise table and log hours worked and number of trips. This helps secure future funding for this type of event.

THANK YOU VOLUNTEERS: This program is operated FULLY by volunteers! Not one person involved is paid. Funds collected are used solely to cover the costs of running the Chip & Haul program.

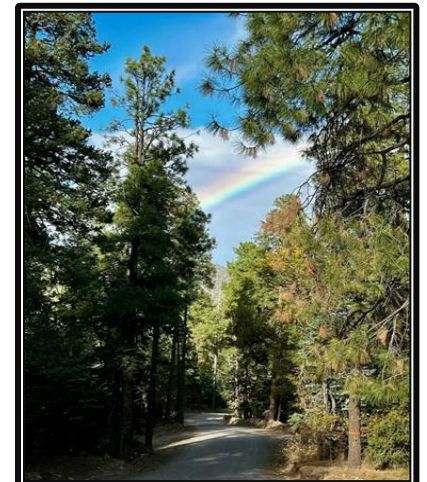

Fire Protection Association, Inc. - Proxy and Instructions:

As provided for in the bylaws of the Walker Fire Protection Association, Inc. ("WFPA"), proxy voting is permitted for the Annual Meeting which will be held at the WFPA Fire Station located at 4980 E. Walker Road, Prescott, AZ 86303, at 9:00am, Saturday May 23rd, 2026. Proxies are available upon request by email at secretary@walkerfire.org, or by phone request at 480-329-8443 or available for download on the WFPA website at www.walkerfire.org. A proxy for each person voting must be correctly completed, signed and returned either by mail to WFPA, PO Box 10174, Prescott, Arizona 86304 or emailed to: secretary@walkerfire.org, attention WFPA Secretary and received no later than Thursday May 19th, 2026, or can be physically delivered to the WFPA Secretary at the Annual Meeting between 9:00 and 10:00 a.m., on May 23^r, 2026.

WFPA Member eligibility to vote is defined by the WFPA bylaws, Article III "Members" and summarized as; 1) owning or participating in the ownership of property within a three mile radius of the Fire Station, property included in the Potato Patch Area Association or otherwise accepted as a Member under guidelines/criteria adopted, from time to time, by the WFPA Board of Directors and 2) consent by State Statute as defined in section 3.1.1.2 through 3.1.1.2.2.6.

The number of total votes eligible by Members shall not exceed one vote per Member and no more than two votes for property ownership held in "joint" ownership interest as defined in Section 3.4 through 3.4.6 of the WFPA bylaws. The total votes eligible are limited as defined, regardless of the number of parcels owned or ownership participation as defined in section 3.9 of the WFPA bylaws.

Proxy will be verified for eligibility and against a Member roster with a record date of May 23rd, 2026. Proxy qualification will be reviewed and verified with final eligibility determined by the WFPA Secretary. Any proxies not signed, not in proper order or not matching the Member roster will be set aside and considered invalid.

NEW EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM - Yavapai County residents are encouraged to sign up.

The Yavapai County Sheriff’s Office, in partnership with Yavapai County Emergency Management, is announcing an important change to the county’s emergency notification system. Effective immediately Yavapai County is transitioning from the Everbridge platform to the new Smart911 / RAVE Alert Emergency Notification System. This system delivers urgent public safety information quickly and reliably, including wildfire evacuations, severe weather alerts, missing persons, road closures, and other life-safety emergencies.

All residents, businesses, and community members are strongly encouraged to register immediately for Smart911 / RAVE to continue receiving emergency alerts.

Text alert YAVAPAI to 78015. Create your profile with home, work, and family contact details.

If you had Everbridge account, your information may have been transferred over.

Ready Set Go



Yavapai County Emergency Management has been busy developing “evacuation zones” A new web page and a new mobile app each allow you to enter your address so that you can receive status alerts. The alerts will designate the “Ready, Set, or Go” status for your zone.

The mobile app is: “genasys protect” and the web page can be accessed at “yavapaiready.gov”. Scroll down to “Evacuation Zones” or go directly to “protect.genasys.com”.

If you haven’t already done so, you should also sign up for **alertYAVAPAI** (or google it) to receive notifications by any two or all of the following: email, text or mobile phone.

Yavapai County no longer uses “Code Red”.

In all cases, if you receive a “GO” notification, go now! Do not stay to defend.

The Yavapai County Sheriff’s Posse, under the direction of the Yavapai County Sheriff, will still be responsible for directing evacuations in the event of an emergency.
