

FROM THE FIRE CHIEF...



In 2018 we had a busier fire season here in Walker than we did in 2017. Last year may have been scarier given that we had to evacuate the community under the threat of the Goodwin Fire but this year we had two fires in Potato Patch; the Bluff Fire and the Treehouse Fire. Not only did we have a great turnout from Walker Fire personnel, but we had a lot of help from the Forest Service, Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management (DFFM) as well as neighboring departments. The other departments and agencies in the area understand the fire danger we have here and luckily, they want to come help us when we need it.

We've seen interest in volunteering increase, we had two new full-time residents get their red card (required training/fitness to fight wildland fires) in 2018 and another full-timer has also recently joined our ranks. Volunteers who live out of the area play a vital role in fires and other types of calls that can last an entire day but having more full timers actively engaged with the department allows for more optionality in our immediate response to an incident.

In last fall's letter we acknowledged the retirement of station boss Dan Hauck, he moved out of the area. His replacement is shy about publicity, so we will respect that here but will say he has exceeded any expectation we could have hoped for in a new station boss.

As the temperatures start to drop and we all use our stoves and fireplaces more frequently we would request that you get your chimney swept or otherwise serviced. A sooty chimney is an easy place for a fire to start. On a related note, closing doors inside your home can be a very effective way to limit the flow of a fire, to slow it down dramatically which hopefully reduces any damage that might otherwise occur.

The department will continue to utilize its Facebook page at facebook.com/walkerfiredept to disseminate information as well as our longstanding email distribution list, but we would set the expectation that the Facebook page will be updated sooner than an email can go out.

If you will be living here full time in the winter, we would request that you do all you can to get your road/driveway plowed after any snow storms. We may not be able to drive through a foot or two of unplowed snow in trying to get to your house.

At our trainings we regularly talk about the fact that everything we have and everything we do is provided by the community's support, you reading this letter, your support and we are grateful to have you all in our corner helping us.

FROM THE PRESIDENT...

Twice a year I get to write about the WFPA and Walker for these Newsletters. Each time I go through an inventory of things I want to talk about, the list is vast and if left unchecked it would be pages. I try to keep it down to a few thoughts and highlights. This time Volunteers are on my mind as is the unity of the Walker Community that has made the WFPA & Walker Fire Department the success it is.



In 1967, my Grandfather and a bunch of his friends and community members had formed the WFPA. I witnessed the effort to get it going, heard the stories and felt the excitement around it all. It was an exciting time.

Those early days when there were no County building permits required, houses were stick built on logs perched on rocks. But as the roads improved so did the buildings until you see the grand houses being built today.

Originally families came to Walker to escape the desert heat in summer cabins. Remember the roads were rough and not maintained well, depending on the snow this made the winters very rough and unpredictable. Now people come from all over and choose to live here year round. It's a quiet beautiful corner of the world and no one comes here to spend time away from their families and friends but with them.

The WFPA was built on people giving of their time, talent and money. The community united as one to build protection from the terrible consequence of a Wildland Fire. (As we are seeing in California today.)

It was a shoestring operation. Fire Chief Duties were shared year to year by choosing a community member willing to take on the task. In those early days, all it took was to learn how to operate the pump on the old truck we acquired through the State Forestry and answer the siren and CB Radio call for help when a fire broke out. It worked. Neighbors answering a call for help from neighbors. A communal effort that actually saved Walker many times by being quick to respond. The old wives tale of Flip Flops, Shorts and a claw hammer abound and are basically true.

In the 1970's Jon Sumner showed up. A professional Fire Fighter, he became the Fire Chief and a great asset to the WFPA. (He is still involved today) As you may or may not be aware, we recently named the fire house in his honor. The Jonn Sumner Walker Fire House.

Today, all of our fire fighting Volunteers are required to receive professional training and certification which includes a arduous annual physical fitness test, personal firefighting equipment and clothing. A regimen of continued training has been established by our Fire Chief Roger Nusbaum.

In addition to our Fire Fighters, other volunteers are needed to make the WFPA an efficient organization. Many have served on the Board of Directors, an equally important function. To really maintain the 'Business side' while the Fire Chief runs the 'Operational side'. This is a typical business model and has worked very well for the WFPA for many years.



FROM THE PRESIDENT (cont'd)...

We are all volunteers. Board, Fire Chief, Community/neighbors that share their skills, and Fire Fighters. All graciously giving of their time and talents to the betterment of our community.

Our Newsletter comes out twice a year to neighbors, which comes out to be approximately 1200 give or take. They are basically a great way to reach our community, share some updates with you as well as a raise funds. And it works. We receive great feedback from you along with your donations to do what we need to do. Your Board operates this as the \$100,000.00 a year business it is.

You keep us afloat, thank you.

You'll see an article in this Newsletter about the effort to get a building in the Potato Patch area to base some of our equipment in. We dodged two big bullets this year from fires there. There will be a fund raising effort to get that done.

The WFPA has several social events that are also fundraisers. Pancake Breakfasts on the last Saturday April through September draws 200 plus friends. It's a great way to meet neighbors and be a part of the WFPA community. Bingo, the 3rd Saturday, is a lot of fun, much smaller but growing. Walker Kids Day is in its third year and growing too. The FF Appreciation Pig Roast now scheduled for the Labor Day Weekend has become a big event, with well over 300 people attending. But Walker Day is the Granddaddy of them all. Combined with the yard sale and all the activities it's a huge success.

All put together and ran by Volunteers.

We appreciate the continued Community support you all give us. We are always looking for new volunteers. Just show up, everyone is welcome. It's rewarding, important and needed to keep our Walker Fire Department viable.



We are a Member funded/driven, not for profit, section 501(c)(3) volunteer organization formed 50+ years ago by Walker Members like you. The WFPA provides the first line of defense between hazard and safety for the Walker community. The WFPA receives minimal to no funding from the government and has historically had to rely on 35% to 40% of the Walker Membership to donate 100% of it's annual operating budget.

Fire department volunteers and your Board are extremely frugal and have managed the department's finances prudently in both good and bad times and through several challenging recessions. The department has no debt and a reasonable cash reserve to insulate it from an unforeseen events. Potato Patch Fire Garage

In late August, the Walker Fire Protection Association (WFPA) Board of Directors sent a letter to Potato Patch Board of Directors, asking if they would entertain the concept of building a Fire Garage in the Potato Patch area to house WFPA fire apparatus. During the fire season of 2018, a Walker Fire truck was located at a residence in the Potato Patch area. That concept proved to be very successful. There were 3 fires in the area during the 2018 fire season.


Over the Labor Day holiday, the Potato Patch Community voted overwhelmingly in favor of moving forward with construction of a one or two bay Fire Garage to house Walker Fire Department apparatus. The Potato Patch Fire Garage would provide much better response times to Potato Patch and also provide better fire protection for the Walker area. The building plans are currently being discussed and developed between members of the WFPA and members of Potato Patch. The overall concept of this garage would be similar to the arrangement developed for the Big Bug Fire Garage. The Potato Patch Fire Garage will be located in the Potato Patch Community Park.

Construction is tentatively slated to begin in late Winter or early Spring of 2019 with the hope of having the building completed in late Spring, just in time for 2019 fire season.

The process is just getting started and there is a lot of work to do over the winter months before construction can begin, but this enhancement will significantly improve fire protection and response times for both Walker and Potato Patch.

Register for Yavapai County's <u>Emergency Notification System</u> (ENS)——Update, please read <u>You should verify your contact phone numbers and property locations in Yavapai County.</u> To sign up or verify your information, look for the Emergency Notification System dropdown and select the "Click here to sign up" banner at www.ycsoaz.gov. Follow the prompts for your opt-in registration and preferred phone number, con-

tact method (email, text, voice...), and enter your property address. The site will convert the address to GPS coordinates automatically and will confirm registration once saved. You should note that all Yavapai County published residential and business landline phone numbers are automatically included in the database, registering with the site will permit you to add additional contact methods (cell phones, text and email addresses).

You can sign up for APS alerts that include alerts for billings, power usage and power outage notifications at; https://www.aps.com/en/residential/accountservices/alerts/Pages/home.aspx. Of course, if you are in your home when the power goes out, the alert may be an aggravating "blinding flash of the obvious." The service does however, provide when available, the general location of the outage and an ETA of power resumption. This alert can be set up for any property in the APS service area. For second homes or when on vacation, this alert may be a helpful notice, especially with cold winter temperatures coming.

WALKER TRASH COLLECTION SERVICES

TIME TO RENEW YOUR TRASH SERVICE

It's time to renew your annual trash subscription. The subscription runs January to December for the 12 months. Six month subscriptions are generally for April-September or May-October. The rates are \$180.00 for 12 months, \$120.00 for 6 months or \$30.00 for a month. We change the lock combination at the end of January.

We operate this service for your convenience and to avoid people burning their garbage especially during the dry months. We have struggled with volume issues because there are a few people who continue to leave the locks open and a few people who use the dumpsters to deposit all sorts of things that are not household garbage. We've had appliances, rolls of carpet, construction debris even a kitchen sink and cabinets.

This service is for household garbage. Please take other items to the dump yourself. That includes yard trimmings and large boxes. If

the dumpsters are full don't just put yours on the ground. The service comes Monday and Thursday to empty the cans. If you can, time your trips to take advantage of that schedule. I know the weekenders like me need to use them on Sundays and they can be full especially if they've been left open or when non-household debris has been placed in them.

We run the risk of losing the service if the illegal dumping continues. Please let me know if you see anyone abusing the service.

The accountant keeps the records, Shad Bruce and Linda Emmett (928) 778-2566 handle the mail, locks and any issues with the dumpsters.

Water, Water Anywhere?

Wait, my property doesn't have a hydrant! What will my Walker Fire Department do for water in the event of a fire?? Great question and one of the biggest shortfalls of rural fire departments. The WFPA has three water "tenders" which are always filled with 2,000 gallons of water each, in addition a few hundred gallons stored on first response fire trucks. Since we do not have piped water to hydrants, the tenders must transport water to the fire trucks and once emptied, must refill

and repeat the process as quickly and safely as possible.

Where do the tenders get their water?

The fire station has 10,000 gallons of stored water and there are some local private contract water tender owners in our community that might be able to respond in the event of need. Otherwise, the WFPA tenders must make their way down Walker Road to refill in Prescott, a long and timely process using precious minutes. And in the event of fire, the water in the tenders and at the station will surely be used up very quickly.



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Isn't there anywhere closer the WFPA might access water??

YES and you might be the answer depending on where a fire incident occurs. The WFPA knows there are water ponds, reservoirs, contract tenders and private water tanks scattered throughout our community. But two things must happen before our thirsty tenders can effectively use local water; 1) the WFPA must have authorization in advance and 2) they have to map this authorized water by address/GPS points to know where it is when they need it.




